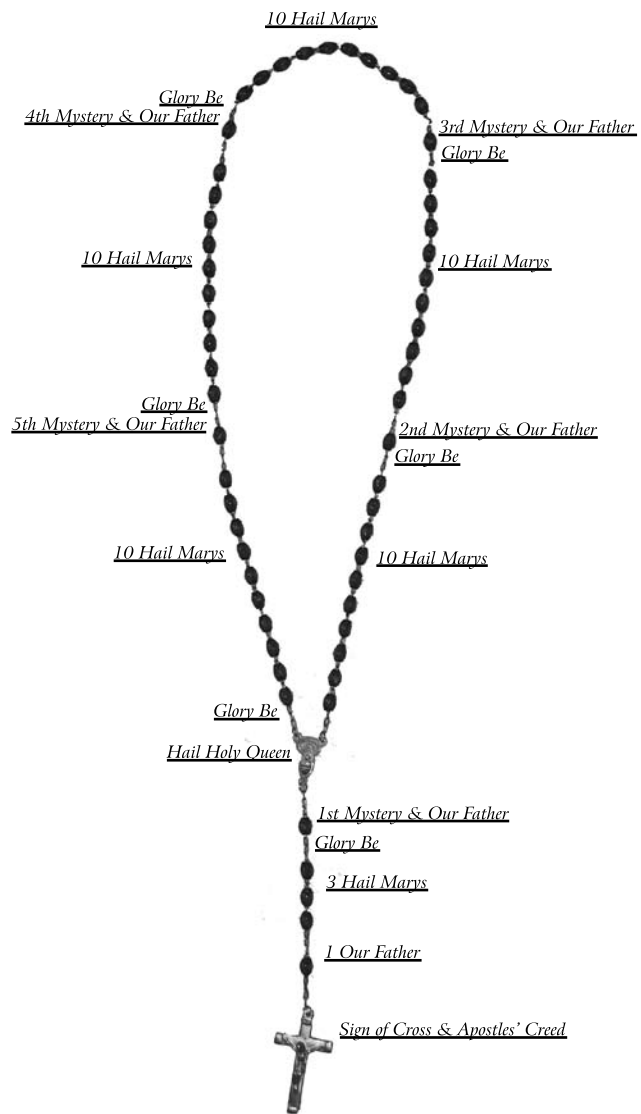


Why should I pray the Rosary?

The Rosary is a special set of prayers to God that helps us to remember the most important events in the lives of Mary and Jesus.

There are a total of 20 Mysteries that tell the story of Mary and Jesus. Each group of 10 Hail Marys is called a decade, and each decade is a different mystery.



Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. The 5 Joyful Mysteries

Luke
1:26-38
1. *Annunciation*
God sent an angel to ask Mary to be the Mother of Jesus. Though she was afraid, she said, "Yes."

Luke
1:39-45
2. *Visitation*
The angel told Mary that her cousin, Elizabeth, was also going to have a baby. Mary went to help Elizabeth, who became the mother of John the Baptist.

Luke
2:2-20
3. *Birth of Our Lord*
Jesus was born in the city of Bethlehem in a stable, because it was the only place that had room to house the family.

Luke
2:22-35
4. *Presentation in the Temple*
After Jesus was born his parents took him to the Temple in Jerusalem and presented Jesus to God.

Luke
2:41-52
5. *Finding of Jesus in the Temple*
When he was older, Jesus went with his parents to a service at the Temple. He stayed after the service to talk to the teachers and Mary and Joseph thought he was lost.

The 5 Luminous Mysteries

Matthew
3:16-17
1. *Baptism of Jesus*
John baptized Jesus in the Jordan River. The heavens opened and the Holy Spirit proclaimed Jesus as God's son.

John
2:5
2. *Wedding at Cana*
Jesus changed water to wine because his mother, Mary, asked him to help. The disciples saw this miracle and believed in Jesus.

Mark
1:14-15
3. *Proclamation of the Kingdom*
Jesus came to Galilee preaching the good news of God. He told everyone to ask for forgiveness and that the Kingdom of God was near.

Luke
9:28-29
4. *Transfiguration of Jesus*
The Apostles were on Mount Tabor with Jesus when they saw the glory of God shining from Jesus. God said to them, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

Matthew
26:26
5. *Institution of Eucharist*
At the Last Supper, Jesus washed the Apostles' feet, knowing already that Judas had betrayed him. He then offered his body and blood under the signs of bread and wine.

The 5 Sorrowful Mysteries

Matthew
26:36-44
1. *Agony in the Garden*
Knowing one of his friends had betrayed him, Jesus went to a garden to pray for strength. Though he was afraid, he found the courage to die for our sins.

John
18:33-19:1
2. *Scourging at the Pillar*
Pilate, the Roman leader, ordered soldiers to whip and beat Jesus.

Matthew
27:27-31
3. *Crowning of Thorns*
After whipping Jesus, the soldiers took his clothes and placed a scarlet cloak around him. Calling him "king of the Jews," they put a crown of thorns on his head.

Luke
23:26-31
4. *Carrying the Cross*
Though he was in pain, Jesus was made to carry the heavy wooden cross to Calvary. Along the way he saw his mother and friends, who were crying, and Simon of Cyrene, who helped Jesus with his cross.

Matthew
27:33-55
5. *Crucifixion & Death of Jesus*
As Mary watched, Jesus was nailed to the cross and died. Before he died, Jesus asked God to forgive everyone and gave Mary to John and to us as our mother.

The 5 Glorious Mysteries

Matthew
28:1-10
1. *Resurrection*
Jesus was placed in a tomb after his death. When Mary Magdalene came for him, an angel told her he had risen from the dead as he had promised.

Luke
24:36-53
2. *Ascension*
Jesus went with his mother and friends to a place near Bethany. He blessed those with him and God took him to heaven.

Acts
2:1-12
3. *Descent of the Holy Spirit*
Jesus promised his followers that he would always be with them. On Pentecost, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to them and they were filled with God's peace.

Revelations
12:1-2
4. *Assumption of Mary*
When Mary died Jesus took her body and spirit to heaven to be with him. Mary looks down from heaven and cares for us.

Revelations
12:1-2
5. *Coronation of Mary*
Jesus and the angels welcomed Mary when she entered heaven. She was crowned the Queen of Heaven and the Universe. In heaven she appears with a robe made of the sun, the moon under her feet and a crown of 12 stars on her head.

The word rosary comes from Latin and means a garland of roses, the rose being one of the flowers used to symbolize the Virgin Mary.
