"One of our granddaughters in Minnesota became a teenager this past year. She greatly enjoys reading, dance, music and, of course, her friends and her phone. Her parents expect her to complete her chores, school work, be courteous and respectful of others and among other things, to be concerned about the world we live in.

Two years ago—to her parents' great surprise—her school called and said she had received detention: she had left school without permission and joined a protest march! Her parents were somewhat upset, but we were very proud of her.

This past May, with the killing of George Floyd, our granddaughter began by verbalizing anger at the injustice, joined others on Instagram by making her screen go black and started to write about white privilege. To her credit, this time she asked her parents' permission to join the [peaceful] protest march in Minneapolis. They said yes and joined her. Our granddaughter gives us great hope that this generation of 'doers' will bring out the social changes so that the part that says 'All men (people) are created equal' finally becomes a reality."

# Justice is our Work

he work of justice is, at its core, about inspiring hope. We work to inspire hope in those who are oppressed and those who have lost hope in a system that has failed them. Our justice ministry focuses on education, advocacy and working for systemic change. While some of our justice work is direct service, a large portion is more indirect and serves as the foundation of each of our ministry efforts. We truly believe that justice is at the heart of all of our work as Presentation Sisters.

Our justice commission strives to immerse Presentation People (Sisters, cojourners, employees and friends for justice) more deeply in the work of promoting justice issues, both locally and globally. We encourage prayer and build awareness of where systemic change is most needed in our world today. We work to educate those around us through media, conversations, lobbying, advocacy and the distribution of informational materials. While the COVID-19 pandemic has curbed some of these efforts, we are able to virtually participate in Zoom meetings, dialogue and prayer services.

Collaboration and connection with other organizations, such as the International

Presentation Association, Conference of Presentation Sisters, Avera Health, Presentation College and the Leadership Conference of Women Religious, to name just a few, are key to our justice work. We also connect



with individuals who share our heart for justice.

These partnerships are at the heart of systemic change and inspire hope that ripples throughout our communities. •

We join with other like-minded organizations from around the world in furthering the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals. These 17 goals offer a foundation for ending poverty and hunger, caring for land and water, creating gender equality, building more accountable institutions, and acting to address climate change. Our 2020–2025 focus with the UN is to honor and advance the rights of women and children, the rights of the Earth and the rights of indigenous and tribal people.



In partnership with the Watertown Coalition and Mother of God Monastery, we continue our education and awareness efforts on the issue of sex trafficking. Our new billboard message will rotate throughout northeast South Dakota.





With a contemplative presence and in partnership with others working for global justice, we willingly go forth to any part of the world to work for justice, alleviate oppression and promote human dignity.

We open our compassionate hearts as we stand alongside all who are suffering.

## ABERDEEN AREA Hispanic Outreach

he COVID-19 pandemic has had a direct impact on our ministry with Hispanic residents in the Aberdeen area. Personal visits are important to assess needs and establish a connection with those whom we serve. As these visits have become difficult, we are relying on phone calls, texts and emails to communicate or provide translation services.

The Delta Dental Van comes to Brown County a few times each year to serve children who may not be able to pay for services in a traditional dental office. Last year, Sister Myra took a mother and

her twin girls to the van for a checkup. The girls' teeth were badly decayed and in need of immediate



care. Sister Myra was able to locate a local dentist who was willing to work with the family for several months to give these girls healthy teeth. A partnership of the Presentation Sisters, Delta Dental Van and a local dentist offered this act of love and provided hope for a family in need.

Sister Consuelo received a call from Rita\*, for whom she had provided medical translation in the past. Rita wasn't feeling well and they were concerned she might have cancer. Because of COVID-19, Sister Consuelo could make her appointments but could no longer accompany her. The clinic Rita visited used the language line, but Rita had more questions when she returned home. Sister Consuelo was able to call the clinic to get the answers the family needed and also conveyed the test results that told Rita she was cancer-free. **Praise and thanks to God!**

## Caminando Juntos WALKING TOGETHER

or those ministering at Caminando Juntos, inspiring hope is a way of daily life. Kathy Donis, office manager, is at the heart of the ministry and welcomes over 1,200 drop-in visitors yearly. She helps to fill out forms, connects clients with basic needs and orients new arrivals to the community. Angelica recently joined our ministry to provide support for the Caminando Juntos team.

Each year, Caminando Juntos educates and empowers hundreds of Latinos living in the Sioux Falls area through their educational programs. We have one of the few ESL programs in the area that is free and the only program specifically serving Spanish-speaking adults. This fall, we will begin offering a virtual bilingual story time as a way for parents to connect with their children at home and develop early literacy skills.

Over the past six years, we have assisted more than 60 young people, also known as Dreamers, obtain Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival

status. We also work collaboratively with other organizations to promote programs, services and resources in the community that benefit our clients and foster hope for their future.

We have been working creatively over the past several months to continue to serve the Hispanic community during this pandemic. We created a hotline number for our clients to use for emergency or high priority needs, such as food and housing assistance. We are primarily conducting business via the phone and average 30 calls daily. As the need presents itself for in-person consultations, we are slowly re-opening for appointment-only visits. The need for assistance has climbed dramatically and we continue to work to fill gaps where our clients do not qualify for other forms of support services.

For over 100 years, our Sisters have been serving in education ministry and supporting Catholic education in the Sioux Falls Diocese. Through the generous support of our donors, each year our committee selects 40 students to receive a \$750 scholarship for Catholic education and three students receive a \$1,500 Catholic high school scholarship. This year, we received 111 applicants for the \$750 scholarships and 21 for the high school scholarships. We believe an investment in the Catholic education of area youth will nurture their Catholic values and provide a solid foundation for their futures. •

### Good Samaritan Ministry FOR ADULTS & CHILDREN

or many years, we have worked collaboratively with area non-profits to assist those in need. In September 2019, we established a deeper partnership between our Good Samaritan Ministry and The Journey Home to distribute funds to individuals and families needing temporary assistance. The Journey Home has provided assistance to over 230 people since this partnership began, with over 130 of them assisted through the Good Samaritan Ministry. One requirement of those who receive financial assistance is that they must take part in budgeting classes that will assist them in becoming more financially secure.

Recently, a woman came to The Journey Home. She had been released from prison, was struggling to find work and also going through a divorce. She has partial custody of her three children and needed some temporary assistance as she worked toward a better life. The Journey Home was able to assist with her utility bill and gifted her with a food box and a gift card to a local grocery store. Since then, she has been able to find a job, mend relationships with her children and their father, and maintain her sobriety. She is also now regularly attending church and growing closer to God. Throughout these past few months, we have seen our nation, as well as local communities, come together, uplifting our neighbors in need. We are thankful that many of our families received additional outside resources as they continue on their journey toward sustainability. Requests have once again increased. With your partnership, we are able to provide much-needed hope to individuals who have been hit especially hard during this world-wide crisis. •

# Kaoma, Zambia, Africa

resentation School in Kaoma, Zambia, currently educates over 1,700 orphans and other poor and vulnerable children each year, inspiring in them the hope to build a better future. With the assistance of generous donors, we have not only provided school fees for area youth, but also expanded and built science and home economics classrooms.

Febby was nine years old when a neighbor found her living alone. She finished the school year living with this neighbor but was then moved to live with her grandparents far out in the bush. Through the support of a donor, Febby completed high school with top honors and graduated as a clinical officer (physician assistant) last year. She is now enrolled in college and will begin studying for a pre-med degree. The sponsorship of this young orphan girl continues to provide her with hope and encouragement to aspire for a brighter future.

In addition to our school, we have constructed a conference center and five houses that are rented

to generate income. We also distribute food from Kids Against Hunger to those in need and provide monthly assistance to a few older women in the community. Through our fishing project we are also developing a curriculum to teach fish farming practices to 50 area farmers, with an emphasis on women and youth.

The people of Kaoma have not seen the community spread of COVID-19. Because we know it is just a matter of time, the schools have closed. Access to water is limited and social distancing is difficult, so the virus will present many challenges when it arrives here. •
