WATCH

Mark 13:33 Jesus said to his disciples: "Be Watchful"

The gospel writer uses the word "watch" four times in five verses! That is a clue that this may be an important word. But what does it mean for me, for us, today? Watch for what? The end of the world? My death? The destruction of the earth and those made poor by environmental destruction? Do I just stand by and "watch" it all happen? Or am I being invited to "watch" for where God is? Within me and around amidst all that appears to be violence, destruction and division?
