Lobbying in the South Dakota Legislature

Presentation Person Judy Blauwet joined Sisters Kathleen Bierne and Lynn Marie Welbig as registered lobbyists representing the Presentation Sisters in the SD Legislature. Of the 450 bills entered into the 2023 legislature, our team followed about 90, mostly in the areas of health care, taxation, and education, which also included Native American issues.

Led by a "Dream Group" from the Conference of Presentation Sisters, Presentation Congregations across North America collected non-perishable and canned food items to share with those in need in each local community. This was an inaugural event as we imagine more ways to share experiences in the Conference.

Sister Annrita Johnson

Sister Annrita (Rita Mary) Johnson was born in McIntosh, SD, and graduated from McIntosh Public School. She attended Presentation School of Nursing and Marquette University, Milwaukee, WI, receiving a Bachelor's in nursing. She received a Master's in nursing from St. Louis University, St. Louis, MO, and completed post-graduate work at the University of Utah, Salt Lake City.

For 25 years, Sister Annrita taught Nursing at Presentation School of Nursing and Presentation College. She served on the Congregational Leadership team from 1974-1978 and then became the director of Home Health Agency in New Mexico. She, along with Sister Corita Dickinson, founded Barrett House, a shelter for homeless women and children, half-way home for older mentally ill women and thrift store in Albuquerque, NM.

She also ministered at a retreat center in Albuquerque and on the Pine Ridge Reservation. Sister Annrita volunteered at Avera McKennan's Information Desk prior to retiring at Presentation Convent in 2008. She is grateful she could follow the Congregation's Charism and respond to the needs of the poor.

An avid Minnesota Twins and Vikings fan, Sister Annrita enjoys watching sports and a great game of Bingo.





Sister Gabriella Crowley was born and raised in Henry, SD. After graduation, she attended Presentation Junior College and then St. Catherine College in St. Paul, MN, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Foods and Nutrition.

Sister Gabriella served as a dietitian for 14 years at Presentation sponsored hospitals in Montana and South Dakota. Her ministry work transitioned and for the next six years, she ministered to the Native American people around Mobridge, SD.

Sister Gabriella's ministry led her to catechetical missionary work in Guerrero, Mexico. For 17 years, she shared her compassionate spirit while training men and women to carry out the faith in their villages.

In 1997, upon returning to Sioux Falls, SD, she ministered as an Assistant Director at the Good Shepherd Ministry Center, serving the poor and homeless with her loving smile and welcoming heart.

For the next thirteen years, Sister Gabriella welcomed and walked alongside newly arriving Latinos at Caminando Juntos, the Sisters' sponsored Hispanic Ministry. Now retired, Sister Gabriella continues her love and compassion for all through her prison ministry work.

In her spare time, she enjoys reading and writing letters.

Sister Paulette Garry was born and raised in Huron, SD, graduating from Huron High School. She went on to earn a teaching certificate from Presentation College, Aberdeen, SD, a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education and a Master's Degree in Education from Northern State University, Aberdeen, SD.

Sister Paulette's dedication and love of education was evident throughout her life, often referring to her students as "cherubs". For over 45 years, she shared her warm smile and enthusiasm for learning with elementary and junior high students in Catholic Schools in Mound and Willmar, MN; Madison, Woonsocket, Sioux Falls, Aberdeen, and Dell Rapids, SD. She also served as principal of Sacred Heart, Aberdeen, SD from 1972-1978.

Upon retirement, Sister Paulette returned to Presentation Convent in Aberdeen. She continued serving others as the Community Life and Hospitality Director, as well as Sacristan and as a member of the Sisters' Care Team. Her welcoming and joyful spirit was seen and felt through her daily actions of caring for others.

Currently fully retired, Sister Paulette is engaged in prayer ministry. She also enjoys puzzles, Bingo and visiting with family and friends.

n March 2022, in conjunction with our Congregational Chapter of Affairs, delegates established our directions for 2022-2026. Discernment determined that we will continue building on the Chapter Calls of 2018 over the next four years. We expressed our commitment to live into the Catholic understanding that earth and all its people are one, sacred, and interconnected and in right relationship with the Mystical Body of Christ. Where we have broken this sacred trust of unity, we ask forgiveness, seek reconciliation and celebrate restoration. Through contemplative living and dialogue, we open ourselves to the Spirit, who will lead us to see and act in new ways. As we grow into this commitment, Presentation People and others will be invited to partner with us.

When conducting a philanthropy study in 2021, Maximizing Excellence, LLC, heard from one donor that they receive an average of 30 pieces of direct mail a week, of which 90% ends up in the trash. Not wanting to ignore this staggering reality (possibly for many), of oversaturation and waste, we look for alternative, more eco-friendly ways of sharing our news with you.

This issue of Voices & Ventures has printed 90% fewer copies than previous issues. We feel this is one way we can step-up and take a lead in reducing the footprint we are leaving in this world. While fewer print materials will be mailed, we are striving to keep our information even

The Conference of Presentation Sisters began in the 1950s as a way for the Presidents of each Presentation Congregation in North America to share ideas. For 50 years, the Conference filled this supportive role for the leaders of congregations.

In the early 2000s, however, the Presidents recognized a need to expand their group and looked at new ways of collaborating in mission. From the early part of that decade, the group evolved to include additional leaders on each Congregational Leadership Team. In September 2005, this group also initiated the sponsorship of a collaborative ministry in New Orleans. One of the most significant experiences during this time was the 2006 Convergence that brought over 400 Sisters and lay associates together for a historic gathering in St. Paul. MN. This event allowed Sisters and associates to meet and share their experiences.

Since that 2006 Convergence, there have been several smaller events and projects, but none as big as the Gathering of Presentation People that was held in Sioux Falls, SD in September 2022. The planning team, which began its work in 2019, included a mix of Sisters, associates and employees working together on all aspects of the gathering. This was the first time that Presentation Sisters were joined in full participation by associates, employees and other partners in mission.



On the final day of the Gathering, participants organized into several groups to address the dreams that were voiced during the event. Groups were energized as they gathered together, sharing ideas to shape these dreams and build a collaborative future. Even though attendees were



from throughout the US and Canada, there was a sense of community. Geographical locations may have been different, but all shared a **similar history, charism and mission.**

Aberdeen Presentation Sister Lynn Marie Welbig summed up how the 2022 Gathering of Presentation People helped to expand her idea of Presentation People and our interconnectedness, saying, "The enthusiasm and Nano's spirit, especially as it is manifested in our Presentation People, was so inspiring! The legacy lives on!"



Online Learning Course

To widen the tent even further, an online learning course has been created, offering participants an opportunity to grow in their understanding of the mission and ministry of the Presentation Sisters and in their role in carrying it into the future.

Made possible through a grant from the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, this project provides online classes through the Presentation Sisters Conference website. Online learners can register for classes in the areas of foundress Nano Nagle, history, spirituality, justice, Presentation connection and Mission. Each six-week class includes learning activities such as readings, videos, sharing through discussion forums and a Zoom conversation with other online learners.

Her kind and compassionate heart shown through her acts of service, prayer and by speaking up for those without a voice. She enjoyed cooking for others, sewing and playing checkers. Her fellowship continued through her work with Vocations and the Cojourner (lay associate) program. She served on many committees and boards and was an active member of a Parkinson's support group. A woman of faith, integrity and compassion, she served on numerous boards and committees and was instrumental as the Benedictine and Presentation Sisters collaborated to form Avera Health. The Chief Culture Officer at Avera Health for over 20 years, Sister Joan shared her hospitality and love with all. She loved to try new
